Western Oklahoma State College fall enrollment increases

Altus, OK. – As of September 6<sup>th</sup>, Western Oklahoma State College's overall enrollment was

2.92% higher than fall 2019. Western offers a combination of face-to-face and online formats,

with a large presence in concurrently enrolled juniors and seniors.

Western is currently serving 328 concurrent students, with 33 area high schools

represented. Those represented include Altus, Anadarko, Riverside, Big Pasture, Blair,

"Fall 2020 enrollment has been the biggest unknown going back to March when we were

forced to migrate all our courses to a virtual format. To see an enrollment increase in such a time

and staff to meet the multitude of needs our students have during this pandemic," said Dr. Chad

Enrollment is still open for eight- week format courses, which begin October 13<sup>th</sup>. Those

courses include both face-to-face and online options. Western is also offering winter session
