Over the last several weeks, the Western Oklahoma State College Foundation, Inc. sold 100 numbered golf balls at the cost of \$100/ each. Immediately following our 31st Annual Jim Holland Memorial Golf Tournament on Saturday, August 14th, all purchased golf balls were placed randomly into a container and dropped from a height of approximately 50 feet from Altus Fire Department Ladder Truck #46. The balls were dropped onto a designated hole at the Greens of Altus Golf Course. Since no ball landed in the hole, the ball that landed closest to the hole was declared the winner. The prize was \$5,000.00 which was a 50/50 split of all proceeds raised from the sale of the numbered golf balls. Fifty percent of the proceeds was awarded to the winner and fifty percent was designated to the Jim Holland Scholarship

Mark Thornbrough purchased the winning golf ball. The purchased golf ball #26 landed closest to the hole at 22 inches.

With a high temperature of only 86 degrees and a light breeze, you could not have asked for a better day for golf. The 31st Annual WOSC Foundation, Inc. Jim Holland Memorial Golf Tournament was a 4-man scramble with 18 teams participating in the event. All funds generated go to the direct support of the Jim Holland Memorial Scholarship Endowment, providing scholarships for students attending Western Oklahoma State College. This year's benefit will provide approximately \$20,000.00 in additional funds to the endowment increasing the total to nearly \$340,000.00, with only the interest earned from the endowment providing scholarships on an annual basis.

The 2021 Tournament Champion Team was Team Cross winning with a score of 56-an unbelievable score of 15 under par. Team members: Jay Cross, Brooks Cross, Cody Toole and Clay Toole. Jay and Brooks are father and son. Cody and Clay are brothers.

There were nine prize-hole winners winning a dozen Titleist PROVIX high-quality golf balls each.

Over the 31 years of tournament play, teams have evolved from three generations of golfers. Many of our teams began with father and son groups and currently teams have consisted of grandchildren stepping up to fill a team. The tournament is about more than golf; it is about fellowship, family, scholarship, and a 31-year heritage of golf on the same course year after year.

Jay Holland, the son of the late Jim Holland, was 24 when he played in the first tournament to honor the memory of his dad. Jay plays every year with his, now 20-year old son, Carter Holland.

The annual tournament has received financial support on a continued basis from local businesses, longtime friends, and former students of the late Jim Holland. Linda Holland Copeland, who has never missed a tournament, is always moved by the continued support of the Jim Holland Memorial Scholarship Tournament.
