He would make Hector think. Once Hector left Western, he and Duane became good friends. After Western, Hector decided to take his education in a different direction and followed on at Cameron University to study accounting.



For Hector, becoming a Lifetime Member makes perfect sense. Hector's wife of 48 years, Lupe, was also an alumnus of Western. While enrolled, Lupe had a position in the financial aid office as a work-study. It was there that she found her calling and became a permanent employee assisting students with their financial needs for 19 years before retiring.
