This will be the second year to have shooting sports on campus and we are so excited to see what all they accomplish! The team competed in the ACUI Summer Series Virtual Shoot. The members competing were able to shoot at their local range over a couple of days to gather the scores to enter into the competition. Once everyone had shot, which was a total of 100 shots per event, the scores were sent to ACUI. The team shot 100 Trap, 100 Double Trap, 100 Skeet, and 100 Double Skeet. That was a lot of shooting over a short couple of days, but the results definitely were definitely worth it!

Seven of Western's males placed in the top 15, with 5 placing in the top 10! Hunter

Pence was the big winner of the event! He placed 1st high overall male, winning \$3,000 for the team's MidwayUSA Foundation account. Western's one and only female, Ally Angelly, placed 2nd place in overall female.

Also, among the top high overall males scores on our team are, Cole Wagner 4th place, Baylor Downing-6th place, Gavin Sirmons- 7th place, Jaden Lingle- 8th place, Koby Bates- 11th place, and Darren Lucas- 15th place.

WINDS Trio Grant Program Renewed for Another Five Year Cycle

Western Oklahoma State College-WINDS (Westerns Initiative for Developing Students), a US Department of Education Trio Grants Program was recently awarded a 1.44 million Trio grant for another five year cycle. WINDS is one of thirty (30) TRIO SSS (Student Support Services) in Oklahoma that were funded. This is the 20th year for WINDS here at WOSC.

WINDS provides much needed academic resources to its Western students such as financial literacy workshops, virtual tutoring platforms, professional tutoring, transfer counseling and assistance to four year college admission. In addition WINDS provides for cultural enrichment by the provision for students to attend museums and other historical landmarks. WINDS boasts a viable computer lab called WINDS Success Center. This is a hub for workshops, and tutoring and just a popular "hang out" for the students.

The objectives for WINDS is to increase persistence or retention; stay in good academic standing at Western and to graduate from Western and transfer to a four year university.

The latest funding slate for TRIO SSS programs, nationwide was \$313,459,000.

COVID19 did bring about changes for WINDS, as well by going to a virtual format. It is hopeful that this new grant cycle can bring about some new changes as well as relying on conventional services provided by WINDS here at Western. Our Winds director, Mike Pate, and his team would like to express their sincere gratitude for the original founder of WINDS, Dr. Glyn Olson. She, over 20 years ago, wrote the first grant for WINDS and had the vision that this program would benefit the majority of students who attended Western and with the resources

the grant provided would ensure student achievement from the beginning. Dr Olson also believed that the WINDS program would progress each year and that partnering with Western together the formula would be success.
