Over 300 students grad-Western from Oklahoma State College this year. Western faculty and staff were thrilled to congratulate the graduates as they walked the stage at commencement on May 10.

Over 1,500 people attended this year's commencement ceremony to cheer on their student. This year's ceremony was a little bit different than those in the past, highlighting three student speakers, instead of one commencement speaker.

"For my first graduation as President of Western, I wanted to do something outside of the norm," said Dr. Chad Wiginton, Western President. "I have been an employee of this institution for almost 18 years, and the students that we serve are the reason I continue to be excited about going to work. The opportunity to impact each and every
