Celebrating Mike Schulz: the 2019 WOSC Hall of Fame Inductee

The Western Oklahoma College Alumni Association, along with family, friends and community members, honored Senator Mike Schultz as the 24th inductee into Western Alumni Association Hall of Fame on Friday, September 20.

The evening started with dinner music and live entertainment provided by Americana Artist and Oklahoma native, Kyle Brewer. Mike's long-time Representative friend, Charles Ortega gave a glimpse into the life of Mike Schulz, the man and the politician.

Schulz was a graduate of Altus High School and attended Western Oklahoma State College before pursuing a degree in agriculture at Oklahoma State University. Schulz has always had a passion for farming and a passion for the people of Oklahoma.

In a 2006 special election, Schulz was elected to the Senate and served for twelve and a half years as

the Oklahoma Senator for District 38. Throughout his Senate tenure, Schulz served as the majority whip, majority floor leader, and in 2017 was elected President Pro Tempore. Over the years, Schulz has been a crucial part of important legislature here in the state of Oklahoma

and has received numerous awards including the 2014 Distinguished Service Award from the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. Education is important to Schulz.

"Western is an important part of our family," Schulz said. "Both of our children graduated

and truly blossomed during their time on campus. Western helps bridge the gap for students who are not ready for a four-year institution."

Mike also commented on how humbled he was to be added to such a prestigious group of former Hall of Fame inductees like

Senator Robert M. Kerr, who he had the privilege to replace in the Senate.

In his closing remarks, Dr. Chad Wiginton, Western's President, congratulated Mike and told those in attendance that Senator Schulz was very deserving of this honor.
