Outstanding students from across Oklahoma were recognized at the All Oklahoma Academic Team and OACC President's Tuition Waiver Award Ceremony, held at the Oklahoma State Capitol. This annual event celebrates academic excellence and leadership among two-year college students and high school seniors planning to further their education.

Representing Western Oklahoma State College, Rustin Fraser and Miguel Clemente were named to the prestigious All Oklahoma Academic Team. Fraser, whose career goal is to become an orthopedic surgeon, and Clemente, who aspires to be a business owner, earned this recognition through their outstanding academic achievements and leadership. The All Oklahoma Academic Team is selected based on academic excellence, extracurricular involvement, and service to their communities.

To be eligible for the All Oklahoma Academic Team, students must have a minimum 3.50 GPA, be on track to graduate in 2025, and be nominated by their college. #### Wilson Represents Western in Washington D.C.


More than 1,000 TRIO professionals from across the country gathered in the nation's capital March 16-19 for the Council for Opportunity in Education's annual Policy Seminar. Among them were several dedicated advocates from Oklahoma, including Western Oklahoma State College's very own Bruce Wilson, who joined the effort to ensure continued support for programs that provide essential resources to first-generation and low-income students. The seminar featured three days of intensive training, culminating in a day of congressional visits where TRIO representatives met with

lawmakers and their staff to emphasize the importance of educational opportunity programs. Among those engaged in these critical conversations were Oklahoma TRIO professionals, who met with Senator James Lankford's education staffer to discuss the impact of TRIO services on students in the state. Through their participation in the Policy Seminar, TRIO professionals continue to demonstrate their dedication to strengthening educational opportunities, ensuring that doors remain open for students striving to achieve their academic and career goals.
