Shortgrass School of Music presents a Fall Concert | September 28

The Friends of WOSC Performing Arts is pleased to sponsor the popular women's community vocal music ensemble for a Fall Concert. The concert event will feature the Eine Kleine Girlmusik ensemble under the direction of the outstanding choral conducting skills of well-known musician Donna Tucker. Donna is the founder and artistic director of the Shortgrass School of Music and choral director for the Eine Kleine Girlmusik ensemble. Evelyn Barthold will serve as the piano accompanist and also be featured in two piano solo performances.

Evelyn Barthold grew up on a farm in Denton, TX. There, at the University of North Texas, Evelyn received a B.M. degree in piano performance and a B.S. degree in physics. She did graduate work in physics at Columbia University in NYC but chose to return to her family farm in Denton, where she could continue her first love of church music. For nearly three decades, she worked as an organist at various churches in the Denton area. Another love is for her family property and for providing a home for cats, dogs, and sheep there on her farm. When development came too close to this home for comfort. Evelyn moved to the area of Altus, OK, which not only is agricultural but also embraces the artistry of music and art and history. Evelyn is a pianist and organist at the First Presbyterian Church in Altus, accompanies the Eine Kleine Girlmusik ensemble, and has enjoyed singing with the Community Chorus.

Mary Runyan, a well-known music educator and appreciated for her musicianship as a flute soloist, will also be featured in the concert. Mary Runyan is a 1975 graduate of Fox High School and a 1979 graduate from the University of Oklahoma. She received her MME from SWOSU in 1987. Mary spent four years (1980-84) in band and vocal music at Velma-Alma Public Schools. In 1984, Mary started teaching in Altus. She taught at Northeast Junior High, Altus Junior High, and in 1997, became the director for "That Altus Band." Mary retired in 2017 after teaching for 37 years. Mary is a member of many professional organizations, including the University of Oklahoma Alumni Band, Oklahoma Music Educator's Association, and Oklahoma Bandmaster's Association, and has held many regional and state offices. She is a National Board Certified Teacher, an OMEA Exemplary Teacher, a 2015 OBA Band Director of the Year, a 2018 OBA Hall of Fame Member, a SWOBDA Band Director of the Year, and a Federated Music Club's State Musician of the Year. Mary is an active band clinician and adjudicator and has a private flute studio. Mary is a member of the local MacDowell Club of Allied Arts, PEO, and is a member of First Baptist Church, where she is a member of the worship team. Donna Tucker has selected a very enjoyable and diversified selection of music and prepared the ensemble for an enjoyable performance.





The ensemble meets weekly for a rehearsal in the choir room at Western Oklahoma State College, hosted by the Friends of WOSC Performing Arts. The United States Air Force first brought Donna Lamar Tucker and her family to Altus during her high school years. She had already studied piano for seven years and began her vocal studies with Nancy Byram. While at Altus High School, her great love for choral music was awakened under the instruction of Kenneth Cox. She was one of the first recipients of Cox's college scholarship program. From there, she attended Altus Junior College, where she studied under the late Don Sears. Donna continued on to Central State University under the tutelage of Frances Spurlock Brazeal, Dr. Coleman Smith, and Dr. Bobbie Ralph. During her career, she has taught on all levels, from preschool through college, including 22 years in public school. She has directed many community choirs and church choirs at all age levels. Donna currently teaches piano, voice, and general music through her studio, Shortgrass School of Music, and directs the community women's choir Eine Kleine Girlmusik.
